How to use this Voter's Guide

The aim of this guide is to help you to cast your vote in an informed manner, consistent with your Christian faith. It will help you to avoid choosing candidates who endorse policies that cannot be reconciled with the moral norms once held by *all* Christians. The pieces of legislation considered by the NSW parliament (all morally unacceptable in their own right) referred to in this voter's guide are:

1. The Adoption Amendment (Same Sex Couples) Bill 2010 (No. 2) amended the Adoption Act 2000 and legalised the adoption of children by homosexual couples (i.e. children being deliberately denied either a mother or father).

2. The Relationships Register Bill 2010 extended the definition of 'de facto partner' to homosexual couples and allowed heterosexual and homosexual non-married couples to register their relationship with the state (which is an attempt to equalise marriage and these so called 'de facto' relationships).

3. The Surrogacy Bill 2010 legalised surrogacy 'parentage orders' for married, 'de facto' and homosexual couples using the IVF system to conceive a child in a multi-party arrangement (i.e. a woman carries another couple's IVF conceived child by legal agreement).

4. The Miscellaneous Acts Amendment (Same Sex Relationships) Bill 2008 amended various other pieces of existing legislation to give legal recognition to lesbian couples where both lesbians want to be considered 'parents' of a particular child (i.e. the non-birth 'mother' replaces the father in applicable situations at law).

5. The Human Cloning and Other Prohibited Practices Amendment Bill 2007 legalised 'Somatic Cell Nuclear Transfer' (a process of human embryo creation without fertilisation), often referred to as 'therapeutic cloning'. It was a bill that further liberalised the destructive embryo research laws enacted in 2003.

6. The Human Cloning and other Prohibited Practices Bill 2003 legalised the use of 'spare' human embryos for scientific testing. Human embryos created in the IVF program were able to be deliberately destroyed and manipulated in the lab after the passage of this bill.

The Lower House (Legislative Assembly)

There are 93 seats in the New South Wales Legislative Assembly. Every voter has a 'local member' who represents their particular area (a 'seat' or electorate). For Kristina Keneally's Labor to win the election in their own right they need to control 47 seats in the Assembly. They currently hold 50 seats. Barry O'Farrell's Coalition (Liberal/National) holds 37 seats and will need to gain an extra 10 seats to form Government in their own right. There is currently 6 Independent representatives in the lower house.

During the Labor government's near 16-year tenure (going back to 4 April 1995), there have been four different Premiers: Bob Carr, Morris Lemma, Nathan Rees and the 42nd Premier of NSW Kristina Keneally. None of them posted pro-life voting records and each of them has supported the anti-life agenda at various crucial moments.

In the last term of parliament, Labor was particularly active in supporting the homosexual activist agenda (see the voting tables inside). Although the Labor Government did not introduce the *Adoption Amendment* (Independent Clover Moore sponsored it), it has been Labor's support of the homosexual activist agenda which enabled broad changes to family law to appease the so called 'gay rights' movement.

Liberal Opposition Leader Barry O'Farrell also has a wholly unsatisfactory voting record: he has supported EVERY one of the bills mentioned above. His Coalition partner, Nationals Leader Andrew Stoner, has a better but imperfect voting record: Stoner supported the *Miscellaneous Acts Amendment (Same Sex Relationships) Bill 2008.*

Candidates to watch The Good* & The Bad in the mix at this election



Dominic Perrottet – Liberal candidate for the safe seat of Castle Hill. Mr Perrottet will be elected. A married

Mr Perrottet will be elected. A married father from a Catholic family, he can be expected to vote the right way on social issues. He is replacing Michael Richardson who has an imperfect voting record. Mr Perrottet has long been active within the socially conservative subfaction of the NSW Liberal Party.



Greg Smith – Liberal incumbent for the safe seat of Epping.

Mr Smith will likely be made Attorney-General if the Liberals win government. Was a leader in NSW Right to Life for many years. Has voted against all of the anti-life legislation put forward during the last term. Quoted St Thomas More in his maiden speech and is a well-known lay member of the Sydney Archdiocese.



Thomas George – Nationals incumbent for the safe seat of Lismore.

Mr George is an Australian born of Lebanese parents. One of the few ongoing members who has voted against all six pieces of anti-life legislation referred to in this guide. Will retain his seat and is a reliable pro-life vote. It is disappointing that other Nationals have not always done the same.



Ray Williams – Liberal incumbent for the safe seat of Hawkesbury

Mr Williams is one of the only MPs who voted the right way at every opportunity. He comes from a horse-training family. Although he has supported the socially liberal faction in recent internal party wrestling, Mr Williams has a voting record as strong as any of the wellknown conservatives in the party.



Emily Dunn (left) – Mulgoa Simon McCaffery – Macquarie Fields Boutros Zalloua – East Hills Democratic Labor Party candidates The pro-life DLP are running three candidates in marginal lower house seats in western Sydney. In these seats the

in western Sydney. In these seats the sitting ALP members have collectively voted anti-life 15 times and pro-life zero times. In short, go DLP! **Carmel Tebbutt – Labor incumbent for seat of Marrickville. Health Minister.** Ms Tebbutt is a member of Emily's List and has voted in favour of cloning, homosexual adoption and surrogacy. Her seat has a margin of 7.5 % to the Greens. Likely to retain the seat. Could be a future ALP leader. Married to antilife Federal MP and 'PGPDer' Anthony Albanese. Attended Catholic schools.



Verity Firth – Labor incumbent for the seat of Balmain. Education Minister. Ms Firth is also an active member of Emily's List and senior Cabinet Minister. She has voted for every piece of anti-life legislation since entering Parliament in 2007. Her seat is also marginal to the Greens, so Balmain will have an anti-lifer either way. Husband arrested in January for possession of the drug ecstasy.



Gladys Berejiklian – Liberal incumbent for the seat of Willoughby.

Ms Berejiklian is proof that a Liberal whitewash won't be all good news for pro-lifers. Berejiklian is a member of the Parliamentary Group on Population and Development and has voted for all six anti-life bills. A former leader of the Young Liberals in NSW, she has been touted as a future leader. Let's hope not...



Clover Moore – Independent incumbent for the seat of Sydney.

Ms Moore actively supported every piece of anti-life legislation. She introduced the homosexual adoption bill. As Lord Mayor of Sydney she flew the 'gay flag' on the roof of Town Hall. A reliable anti-life vote in the parliament and social progressivist who marches at Mardi Gras. Studied at the Loreto Convent in Kirribilli.



Steven Whan – Labor incumbent for the seat of Monaro. Cabinet Minister. Mr Whan is the only ALP candidate with a margin under 10% who is considered a good chance of retaining his seat. He has voted for every piece of anti-life legislation considered in this guide. His opponent is Nationals candidate and local councillor John Barilaro.



* **Good in this chart is a relative term.** Family Life International maintains that the only truly good candidates are those who respect the natural law and always defend the common good. The persons identified above as 'good' candidates are relatively better than the truly antilife politicians. That does not mean every public statement they have made or will make is acceptable.
