The aim of this voter's guide is to help you to cast your vote in an informed manner consistent with your Christian faith. It will help you to avoid choosing candidates who endorse policies that cannot be reconciled with the moral norms once held by all Christians. Legislation with grave moral consequences, passed by the Western Australian Parliament, is included in the voting records of each current sitting member. Pro-lifers were obviously obliged to oppose these legislative attacks against life and family. The legislation we examined is as follows:

1. Abortion Bill 1998 2. Gay Law Reform Bill 2001/02 3. Human Reproductive Technology (Cloning) Bill 2003 4. Surrogacy Act 2008 5. Voluntary Euthanasia Bill 2010

ELECTION SYNOPSIS

In this election Liberal Premier Colin Barnett is vying for a 2nd term of office for the Coalition government. This is likely to occur, as for the past few years, Labor has been experiencing a devastating string of losses around the country, and according to most indicators, this election promises to be no different.

In this guide we deemed it necessary to reach back into the parliamentary record (Hansard) as far as 1998. Though the majority of the current members were not elected back then (see tables) it is important, firstly because it shows when abortion was decriminalised in Western Australia, but also because the current Premier and Liberal party leader **Colin Barnett** actually voted in favour of it. In fact his whole pro-life voting record is appalling. In the Surrogacy Bill of 2008 (supported by both leaders) the newly elected Barnett government simply re-introduced the original bill put up by the Labor government, with a few regulations, shortly after the 2008 election.

In the opposition camp, Labor leader **Mark McGowan** is currently promising to endorse a private members bill to permit voluntary euthanasia. With such high profile support within the Labor Party, it will most certainly be given more credence and debating time. There have been several attempts to pass a bill of this nature since the 90's - the results of the last failed attempt in the Legislative Council vote of 2010, are tabled on the back of this guide.

Mark McGowan has also indicated his support for the so-called 'marriage equality' bill, which was introduced just prior to this election being announced. It will be voted on after the election.

Labor is of course marred by the noxious **Emily's List**, which has not held as many seats in Western Australia as in other States with its current quota being 3 in the lower house, and 3 in the upper house - however, in this election they are putting up a slew of new candidates. If you examine the marginal seats it is obvious that Emily's candidates are always close to the front of the queue in the Labor Party pre-selection process. These candidates have become a powerful faction within the Labor Party and within our Parliaments. Under the popular guise of *equal representation in politics for women*, there is the deeper agenda of so called 'reproductive rights'. In other words, not just any woman will do – they must be the embodiment of the pro-abortion party platform of the Labor Party.

In past elections FLI's pro-life voting guides have been able to identity which specific MPs are also members of the **Parliamentary Group on Population & Development** (PGPD) - a non-party parliamentary group committed to an ideology that embraces all aspects of the anti-life agenda. However, this nefarious group have pulled down their website and contracted out their secretariat, so all we can report at this time, is that there are approximately 100 State and Federal parliamentarians who are also members of the PGPD. Considering that the sum total of parliamentarians in Australia, state and federal, upper and lower houses is 824, then the PGPD (and the UN agencies that back it) must be quite satisfied with its infiltration of, and influence upon our nation's halls of power.

FLI always recommends consideration of the minor parties and independents who are known for their Christian values and pro-life stance. The stronger the minor party vote, the stronger the warning message that is sent to the major parties. Of course on the lower house ballot if you put a minor party 1st where they have no chance of election, your preference will still flow directly to your preferred major party candidate according to how they are numbered. It is another matter in the upper house, where there is always a chance that a minor party candidate will gain a seat, where they can often play a vital role in the Parliament. In this election there are 2 significant minor parties with Christian values that are worth your consideration. **Family First,** fielding 12 candidates in the upper house and 16 in the lower, and The **Australian Christians** with 6 candidates in the upper house and 42 in the lower.

In summary, it is fair to say that a Coalition victory may slow the Euthanasia and Marriage Equality push – which are both Green party policies, and which a Labor government will most likely support. As always we highly recommend making contact with your member and/or candidates and ask them which way they would vote on these important issues to be faced be the 39th Parliament of Western Australia.


